She is a scholar and professional consultant specialising in environmental, agriculture and indigenous people's cultural outcomes. She is currently the Co-Chair of the Global Steering Committee of Indigenous People's Forum on Climate Change which is about enhancing participation in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and has various indigenous governance roles in New Zealand.

Lisa sits on the International Advisory Committee for "A SHARED Future" (Achieving Strength, Health, and Autonomy through Renewable Energy Development for the Future), a CIHR-funded program of research under the leadership of Dr. Heather Castleden.
